




Because of the increase in the number of reconstruction, repair and construction projects and the required investment amount in this area is around 100 billion USD.





WHY EXHIBIT?

- The building and construction sector is one of the most essential sectors, holding the key to a prosperous future for Iraq. It has an enormous effect on the country's economy.
- The Iraqi construction sector is divided into public which includes government- funded projects (such as roads, bridges, public buildings, and housing projects) and private (including privately funded projects such as dwellings, commercial and residential buildings) sectors.
- Iraq took 6th place when comparing the gross value added of the sector for 2019 to neighbouring and Arab countries. The 2021 Iraqi state budget allocated a total of 1.786 trillion IQD to the Ministry of Construction, Housing, Municipalities, and Public Works, in addition to 263 million USD in borrowed funds.
- Residential construction represented the largest sector in Iraq's construction market in 2020, followed by energy & utilities, infrastructure, commercial, industrial, and institutional.
- The construction industry is expected to register an annual average growth rate of more than 6% during 2022-2025, supported by investments in transport, oil, electricity, education, and housing infrastructure projects.
- The funds from World Bank(100 million USD), UKEF-British Export Finance Agency (30 million USD), Islamic Development Bank(28 million USD), JICA- Japanese Agency for International Cooperation (75 million USD), KFW-German Development Bank (20 million USD), French Government and French Development Agency (10 million USD) contribute the growth of Iraq construction market and expand the building industry.



ONGOING PROJECTS

Strategic National Focus: Government Investment: Over the next two years, Iraq will invest more than \$250 billion in development and infrastructure projects, with a sizable amount going to Baghdad.

Sector Emphasis: To modernize the capital and the surrounding areas, major areas of concentration are housing, transportation, energy, and urban development.

Large-scale ongoing initiatives in Baghdad

The Central Bank of Iraq Tower Location: Baghdad's Al-Jadiriya Height: 37 storeys, or 172 meters

Finish date: 2025 **Price:** \$772 million USD

highest structure in Baghdad.





The Metro Project in Baghdad

Scope: Seven lines totaling around 148 km in

length; 64 planned stations

An estimated 3.25 million passengers per day

are expected to ride.

Finish date: 2029

Invested \$17.5 billion USD

Consortium: Deutsche Bank, French, Spanish,

and Turkish businesses.

Baghdad's Downtown Development

Scope: Mixed-use structures, such as the

highest building in Iraq \$2 billion USD was invested.

Significance: Seek to bring the central

business center back to life.





Housing & Urban Development:

Sadr City Expansion: Ongoing construction of 190,000 residential units in Sadr City, with ambitions for a total of 240,000 homes. **New Sadr City Project:** Development of 10,000 housing units to meet the increasing needs of the population.

Al-Rafeel City: A development spanning 265 km², intended to accommodate 75,000 residents.

Infrastructure & Transportation:

Road Development: 70 initiatives focused on road improvement and paving, covering an area of more than

8 million square meters.

Bridges & Tunnels: 35 projects, including bridges, tunnels, and overpasses, aimed at enhancing connectivity.

Public Transportation: Measures being taken to upgrade public transportation systems, including the Baghdad Metro.

Al-Rashid New City

Location: Outskirts of Baghdad **Capacity:** Over 1 million residents

Investment: US\$10 billion

Features: Modern infrastructure, residential,

and commercial areas.



Energy & Utilities:

Electricity Projects: Initiatives to create an additional 10,000 MW of power generation capacity.

Renewable Energy: A commitment of US\$680 million for investments in solar energy initiatives.

Water & Sanitation: Launch of 26 sanitation projects and 33 initiatives aimed at supplying clean drinking water.

Market Outlook:

Construction Equipment Market: Anticipated growth at a CAGR of 7.4% from 2024 through 2030.

Real Estate Market: Forecasted to reach US\$1.11 trillion by 2025, with a significant focus on residential real estate.

Housing Demand: Plans to build between 250,000 and 300,000 housing units for families in low-to middle-income brackets.

The fast-changing and dynamic construction environment in Baghdad and Iraq offers considerable prospects for investors, developers, and construction experts. With major government funding and an emphasis on modernization, the area is set for significant growth in the years ahead.
